



OUR STORY

Oxfam's work first started during World War II in the UK, when a small group of passionate people in Oxford banded together to send food and advocate for starving families, stuck behind military blockades in Europe. Since then, Oxfam has grown into a global community of multiple affiliates working to create a better future in over 90 countries all around the world.

In 1991, right here in Aotearoa, a small group of dedicated Kiwis set up Oxfam Aotearoa. In just a few months they raised more than \$25,000 (or just over \$40,000 in today's money), for people in the Horn of Africa affected by drought and war. We have come a long way since then, and our focus is now primarily on the Pacific and Southeast Asia – tackling poverty and inequality though our aid, community development and campaigning work.

NICK POTTER AND RENAY DUNCALFE, WELLINGTON

Driven by their strong values, Nick and Renay have been supporting Oxfam Aotearoa since the early 2000s.

"We decided to support Oxfam because of the focus on the Pacific region...and because it campaigns to address the root causes of poverty (not just the symptoms). It's guided by good values, it delivers a high proportion of fundraising to humanitarian relief, and it's a secular organisation working directly with communities.

"Travelling through places such as India and Nepal gave us a strong impression of how fortunate we are living in Aotearoa New Zealand. There is real poverty in our country too - but seeing the poverty that many people experience in the world, often with no safety nets in the form of government assistance, is a real heartopener.

"We both want to give more than we take and leave the world in better shape through our presence and actions.

"We want any material wealth that we leave behind to be put to good use. We focused on charities that contribute to areas that we particularly care about: eradicating poverty, gender equity, caring for victims of violence, and environmental regeneration... All of that's going to require compassionate action, generosity, and patient persistence."

DIANA RUTHERFORD, AUCKLAND

As a devoted mother and grandma, and a retired primary and special-education teacher, Diana knows a thing or two about making a positive and lasting difference to people's lives.

"I've been an Oxfam supporter since the 1970s. I'm certainly no goody two shoes but I do believe that in this life, you get back what you put in. We need to keep up the hope and faith in humanity. When I see things that are unfair, I have to do something about it. You have to get involved and make change. I really believe my life is enriched by what I give and what I do.

"One particularly important way for me to know I'm doing something that will make a lasting difference is by leaving a bequest to Oxfam in my Will. I've supported Oxfam in many different ways over the years. I currently volunteer at the Auckland office; I've made financial donations, bought Oxfam Unwrapped gifts and campaigned for action on climate change.

MAKE A WILL. LEAVE A GIFT. START A LEGACY

Having a valid Will means that what you own goes directly to the people and causes you care most about. If, like many of our supporters, you choose Oxfam, we want to say a heartfelt thank you!

If you haven't written a Will yet, we know that you'll want to think of your loved ones first. However, we truly appreciate that you might also consider leaving something for some of the world's most vulnerable people.

And it doesn't take long to change the world – a simple Will can take as little as an hour to write.

We suggest that you speak to a solicitor to make sure that your wishes can be carried out in the way you would like. And we're always here to answer any questions you may have about including a gift to Oxfam Aotearoa.

There are a **number of ways** to support our work through your Will. You can:

- Include a percentage of the remainder of your estate (known as the residue). After you have provided for your friends and family, just a small percentage, such as 5% or 10%, will make a huge difference. And this type of gift won't lose its value over time.
- Nominate a percentage of your estate you would like Oxfam to receive (from 1-100%).
 This gift will also keep its value over time.
- Leave a specific amount of money, real estate, shares etc. to Oxfam. (This is known as a pecuniary bequest).

WORDINGFOR YOUR WILL

Below is the most effective wording to include a gift to Oxfam Aotearoa in your Will. Please feel free to take this with you when you visit your solicitor.

ALREADY HAVE A WILL?

If you already have a Will and would now like to include a gift to Oxfam, all you have to do is make a "codicil". If you wish, please take a copy of our wording with you next time you see your solicitor and they can simply update your existing Will for you.

"I give, free of all duties and taxes * ______ to Oxfam Aotearoa (Charity Registration no. CC24641) for its general purposes. An authorised receipt from Oxfam Aotearoa will be a sufficient discharge for the executor(s) or trustee(s)."

- *insert either:
- The whole (or ...%) of the residue of my estate.
- The whole (or ...%) of my estate.
- The sum of \$ (amount).
- Details of a particular asset (such as shares or property).

CLIMATE ADAPTATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Extreme weather events pose relentless challenges for Liliany and her family. After a tropical cyclone decimated her poultry flock and destroyed the coop, she lost her main source of income. Extended dry seasons are also making the soil so hot and dry that it kills all but the hardiest plants.

"The cyclone was very strong. Me and my kids were inside the house and the kids were crying. The wind blew off the thatch roof and everything inside the house was wet so we had to move and live with some families. [The cyclone] destroyed the crops. I used to have chickens but not anymore."

As the climate continues to change, communities in the Pacific are being forced to adapt to harsh conditions faster than ever before. By joining Oxfam's local partner, Farm Support Association (FSA), Liliany has been able to learn new innovative farming techniques, grow more resilient crops, cope better with dry seasons and establish a more secure income for her and her family.

"I was one of the first members of FSA here. [In the past] we didn't go to the markets often but when FSA came and told us about the programme, ...we started planting vegetables we could harvest every day, and started going to the market every day.

"Now we're seeing that we make more money than before. With the money I earn, I use most of it for school fees and food at home."

GIVING A PLATFORM TO VULNERABLE WOMEN

Millions of Rohingya refugees like Nur* have been forced to flee their homeland to escape unimaginable atrocities and seek refuge in neighbouring Bangladesh. They then face further risks, living in makeshift homes in crowded camps, where monsoon rains cause floods and outbreaks of deadly diseases every year.

When disaster strikes, Oxfam provides lifesaving support and essentials like water, food and healthcare. We then stay and continue to work with affected communities for as long as it takes.

Within the camps, women and children are exposed to violence, exploitation and abuse.

Oxfam supports women's voices to be heard and works to promote the rights of the most vulnerable. We work alongside local leaders and community members to increase women's access to services, and strengthen their ability to raise their voices and concerns. We support networks of women's groups, to discuss challenges and negative gender dynamics, identify solutions, and encourage women's participation in community life and decision-making.

By choosing to remember Oxfam in your Will you will help women to protect themselves and their children, by challenging gender injustice and promoting transformative change.


Through proceeds from the women's work, they have been able to install water tanks for the first time in their community's history.

This allows them to yield more crops and harvest them during the off-season. They are also able to share knowledge with other members and gain access to local markets.

Yvette (pictured on the front cover) and Makin have seen a difference in their family's quality of life. Their income is higher and more consistent, they have the ability to pay for their children to go to school, and they are able to save money for the future.
